Our Church Website Expanding

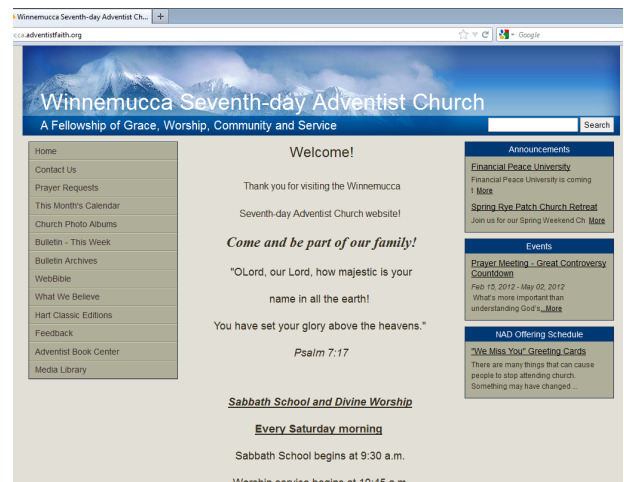
In recent weeks our church website has been growing. Aurora Simsek and Julie Roth have been working to add content to our website and to make it a helpful resource.

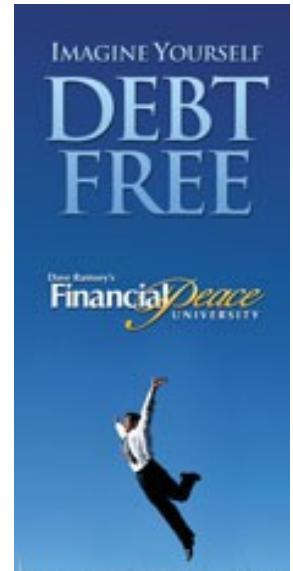

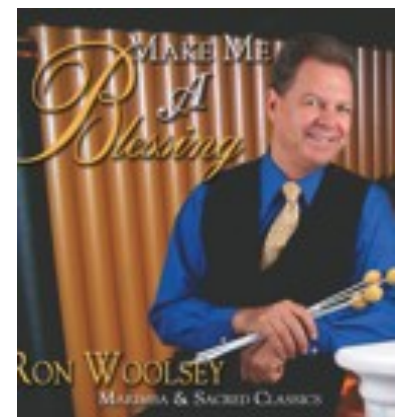
Our special retreat speaker will be Ron Woolsey from Narrow

Sabbath School Training: Connections

Something new is happening in Sabbath School!

Building on the current worship series, *Basic. We Are Church*, Pastor Rob is leading a training seminar entitled **CONNECTIONS** during the early portion of the Adult Sabbath School.

“Implementing Spiritual Gifts in the Church - **CONNECTIONS** - is getting the right people in the right places for the right reasons,” explains Pastor Rob. “For far too long we have let church nominating committees determine the placement of God’s people into service and church ministries. And sometimes it has been like

driving a square peg into a round hole. The ministry is ruined and the individual never reaches fulfillment and becomes discouraged.”

Seventh-day Adventists have long recognized the importance of spiritual gifts. “It is quite generally understood that Seventh-day Adventists are believers in the perpetuity of spiritual gifts ...” wrote J.N. Andrews in the Feb. 15, 1870 Review, “but the use which we make of the doctrine of spiritual gifts is very generally misunderstood... The object of spiritual gifts is to maintain the living work of God in the church.”

Connections is not intended to be an exhaustive study on spiritual gifts. Its goal is to help move members into meaningful places of service in the church.

This study will continue through April. Come early to church and find your connection.

Pastor's Corner:

Dear Church Family;

Imagine with me a very popular, successful convention . . .

Satan called a worldwide meeting. The huge crowd hushed as he stepped up to speak. "We can't keep Christians from going to church. We can't keep them from reading the Bible and knowing the truth. We can't keep them from conservative values, but we can keep them from something else." He paused. Everyone listened.

"We can keep them from forming an intimate, abiding experience in Christ. If they gain that connection with Jesus, our power over them is broken. So let them go to church, let them have their conservative lifestyles, but steal their time so they can't gain that experience in Jesus. This is what I want you to do. Distract them from gaining hold of their Savior and maintaining a vital connection through their day!"

"How shall we do this?" shouted his angels.

"Simple. Keep them busy, busy, busy in the nonessentials of life and invent unnumbered schemes to occupy their minds," he answered.

"Tempt them to spend and spend, then borrow and borrow.

"Keep them from their children. Convince the wives to go to work and the husbands to work six and seven days a week, 10 to 12 hours a day, so they can afford their lifestyles. Tell them that are doing it FOR their children. Hah! That one works well. As their families fragment, their homes won't offer an escape from the pressures of work.

"Overstimulate their minds so they can't hear 'the still small voice.' Entice them to play the radio whenever they drive, to keep the TV, DVDs, MP3s, iPods, cell phones, text messages, and CDs going constantly in their homes. This will jam their minds and

break that union with Christ.

"Fill their homes with magazines and newspapers. Pound their minds with news 24 hours a day. Invade their driving moments with billboards. Flood their mailboxes with junk mail, sweepstakes, catalogs, and every kind of promotions with free products, services, and false hopes.

"Even in their recreation, let them be excessive. Have them return from their recreation exhausted, disquieted, and unprepared for the coming week. Don't let them go out in nature. Send them to amusement parks, sporting events, concerts and movies instead.

"And above all, when they get together, keep them from praying for one another. Let them be involved in soul winning. But crowd their lives with so many good causes they have no time to seek power from Christ. Soon they will be working in their own strength, sacrificing their health and family unity for the good of the cause."
